



Student Dress Code

Purpose

The purpose of the Student Dress Code is to outline Somerville Rise Primary School's requirements for student dress and appearance and to provide information about uniform purchase and support, dress code implementation and exemption processes.

This dress code has been developed by Somerville Rise Primary School's School Council in close consultation with our school community to ensure that it respects the rights of individual students whilst reflecting the values and interests of our community.

The Student Dress Code aims to:

- ☐ foster a sense of community and belonging and encourages students to develop pride in their appearance
- ☐ support Somerville Rise Primary School's commitment to ensuring that our students feel equal and are dressed safely and appropriately for school activities.
- ☐ reduce student competition on the basis of clothing
- ☐ enhance the profile and identity of the school and its students within the wider community.

The School Council has developed a dress code that we believe provides a range of choices for students and is cost effective for families.

Scope

Students are expected to comply with this Student Dress Code while travelling to and from school, during school hours and when attending school activities.

Uniform and Appearance

Somerville Rise Primary School's compulsory school uniform items are as follows:

General appearance

To be dressed in accordance to the Somerville Rise Primary School Dress Code students must conform to the following:

- ☐ The clothes worn must not have a commercial label or commercial logo visible on them

Windcheater/bomber jacket:

- ☐ School windcheater or bomber jacket (a plain navy blue windcheater is acceptable)

Shirt:

- ☐ Jade or navy t-shirt or polo shirt (with school logo)

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- Year 6 students may wear their specific SRS Grade 6 school shirt

Pants:

- Pants must not have a stripe on them of any type or colour.
- Pants worn must not have an external pocket on them (i.e. navy blue cargo pants are not acceptable)
- Pants do not have to be any particular length
- Navy blue track suit pants
- Navy blue gabardine pants (no external pockets allowed)
- Navy blue shorts (no external pockets allowed)
- Navy blue boot leg pants (not jeans)

Dresses:

- Summer dress (in school material, available from Beleza)
- Winter tunic (in school material, available from Beleza)

Hats

- As per our Sunsmart policy students are encouraged to wear a hat that will protect them from the effects of the sun.
- School hats are available from Beleza

Jewellery and cosmetics

Students are not permitted to wear decorative jewellery to school. Stud earrings and sleepers worn in the ears, and watches, are the only acceptable jewellery.

Cosmetics may not be worn at school. Only clear nail polish is permitted.

Hair and Sun safety

Shoulder length or longer hair is to be tied back to help restrict the spread of nits and lice and for student safety.

- Scrunchies and hair adornments should be in the school colours (i.e. jade, white and/or navy blue)
- Students must not wear "unnatural" hair colours to school (i.e. bright purple would be considered an unnatural hair colour)

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School uniform hats must be worn outside from the start of Term 4 to the end of Term 1 and on any other day prescribed by the school. School uniform hats may also be worn outside of this time period, by parent or student choice.

Hats are not to be worn inside.

Purchase Of Uniforms

All items purchased at Beleza conform to the school's Student Dress Code and offer parent's peace of mind in regards to Student Dress Code compliance. Items may be purchased at other outlets but must conform to the standards detailed above.

Support for families experiencing difficulty

Please contact the Principal or Assistant Principal to discuss support that we may be able to provide to families experiencing difficulty meeting uniform costs, including information about eligibility for uniform support through State Schools' Relief. Somerville Rise Primary School also has uniforms available to families to borrow on request.

Implementation

Somerville Rise Primary School will ensure that this Student Dress Code is communicated to all families and students through our website. We will assist students who may be experiencing difficulties complying with this policy where possible.

Students wearing non-compliant uniform items may be asked to change into a compliant item of clothing provided by the school.

If a student is out of school uniform or otherwise breaches the Student Dress Code on a recurring basis, a note will be provided to the student and parents by the classroom teacher. If non-compliance with the dress code becomes a continued occurrence, the Principal will be informed and a phone call home may be required. In this event, the school will continue to work with the student and family to support compliance.

Measures taken by Somerville Rise Primary School to address concerns about student non-compliance with the Student Dress Code will also be addressed in accordance with our Student Wellbeing and Engagement Policy.

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Exemptions to Student Dress Code

We recognise that there may be situations where the application of this dress code may affect students unequally.

Students and their parents or carers may apply either in writing or in person to the Principal for an exemption to this Student Dress Code if:

- an aspect of this code prevents the student from complying with a requirement of their religious, ethnic or cultural beliefs or background
- the student has a particular disability or health condition that requires a departure from the dress code
- the student or their parents/carers can demonstrate particular economic hardship that prevents them from complying with the dress code.

When the Principal receives a request for an exemption, they will:

- consider the grounds for the exemption request
- explain the process to the student and/or their parents/carers
- encourage the student and/or their parents/carers to support their application with evidence.

The Principal or delegate will then try to negotiate a resolution that is acceptable to all parties. If an exemption is not allowed, then written reasons will be provided to the student and/or their parents or carers.
